

We have introduced Tea with a Pony, which has been a huge success for some of the regular participants. #### **The Pony Team**

The past few months have seen some great changes at Gaddesden, with Barney and Wally gradually joining the team in sessions after a period of time settling in. They are both doing really well, taking at least a session a day with Wally doing slightly more - we still have some work to do with certain areas such as mounting from the lift or hoist but these things will come; we've only had them about 4 months so the progress so far is brilliant.

All of the boys now get more regular hacks out round the estate and some more schooling work from staff; both these things are vital for our ponies' welfare, longevity and happiness within RDA. For Melvin, Barney and Wally especially, this work is about their happiness but also back muscle as this needs improving to enable them to work in a more beneficial way for them and us; we are already seeing the positive effects this is having with Melvin, who has come on so much since we got him and started this work. He is comfortable and happy working in sessions as well as being the main horse for Tea with a Pony sessions (he practically brings himself in ready for this!). Bramble has loved hacking out and the hope is to do this more and include more fun hacking for him. Bill equally has enjoyed hacking out (especially with Barney, where he is adamant that despite being 2 hands shorter he will keep up all the way!). Blue loves a gentler hack round the estate and spends the whole time ears pricked, happily marching out and waiting for his trots that he loves.

As some of you may already know we had decided to retire Bramble, so started to ease of his work and get riders comfortable with a different pony ahead of this happening.



However, after doing this Bramble has really improved both mentally and physically - his sparkle is back, his coat is shining and he just looks/feels better all round. So, we have amended our decision and he will be semi retiring, meaning he will stay with us, doing one session maximum a day, combined with staff schooling and hacking out round the estate. As this clearly is an arrangement he likes, this gives us time to search for a new pony but without putting extra stress onto the rest of the team.



What a great team of ponies we have!!

Towards the end of their well deserved break, we start to get the team back to being ready for their return to RDA and work. As well as an important and accurate weigh bridge session for them all, we begin schooling and lunging for those that need it. Such good boys!

We were thrilled when Louise, our Centre Manager and Coach, applied to RDA National for a place on the new RDA Advanced Coach training course and was picked from a strong field to undertake the training. We wish Louise well and are delighted that we will have a nationally accredited Advanced Coach as part of our team.
